#### Annual Review 54<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting Karachi December 18, 2019

#### Distinguished Members of Pakistan Sugar Mills Association

I would like to begin by acknowledging the tremendous efforts of Zonal Representatives of PSMA in efficaciously defending a counter narrative of Pakistan's sugar economy. I am honored to present the Annual Review of PSMA at the 54th Annual General Meeting for the session ending September 30, 2019. Bumper sugarcane crop (83mln tonnes), record sugar production (6.6mln tonnes) for 2017-18, and inadequate water supply down casted sugarcane plantation and per acre yield for 2018-19. There was 18% decline in area planted and 19% decline in sugarcane produced for 2018-19. From 2010-11 to 2018-19, Pakistan's sugar production has been, on average, 14% more than domestic consumption, putting a downward pressure on sugar price. The year 2019-20 could potentially face about 4% decline in area of sugarcane plantation on account of water constraint for sugarcane crop compared to other competing crops like, Maize, Rice and Cotton (Table-1).

Sugar production in 2018-19 was 5.3mln tonnes. Supplemented by carry forward from 2017-18 season of 2.4 mln tonnes, total availability in the country was 7.7 mln tonnes (Table-2).

#### Price of Sugar & Sugarcane 2018-19

Due to surplus supply in the pipeline for the first two & half quarters of the year, sugar ex-mill price during the year remained moderately depressed, even below its cost of production. In the absence of a mechanism for matching the cost of production with selling price of sugar, sugar industry incurred losses.

The average retail price of sugar during calendar year 2017 was Rs. 57.71/kg and dropped to Rs. 53.85/kg in calendar year 2018. Given the cost of production of Rs. 63.52/kg and sugarcane indicative price of Rs. 180/40kg for Punjab, KPK and Rs. 182/40 Kg for Sindh for the year 2018-19, losses to sugar millers were inevitable.

However, in late 2019 price structure improved after export. The average month wise exmill rate of sugar in Punjab and Sindh during the start of the sugar year (Oct-2018) was Rs. 48.9/kg and ended at Rs. 69.26/kg by Sep-2019, up by 41.64%. Similarly the whole sale price improved from Rs. 51.41 to Rs. 70.91, a 37.91% increase. The year average ex-mill price of sugar in 2018-19 was Rs. 59.05/kg, average whole sale price was Rs. 60.94/kg and average retail price was Rs. 64.27/kg. Table 3 & 4.
